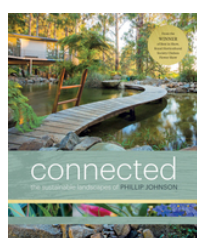

KEN THOMPSON – THE SCEPTICAL GARDENER

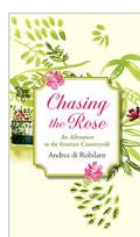

Connected tells the stories behind the commissioning, design and execution of 19 gardens designed by Phillip [with insights from their owners].



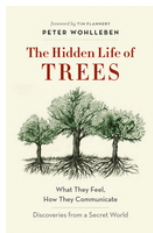
ANDREA DI ROBILANT – CHASING THE ROSE

DANIELLE CLODE – THE WASP AND THE ORCHID

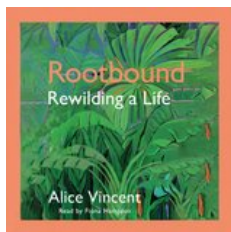

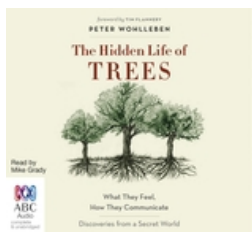

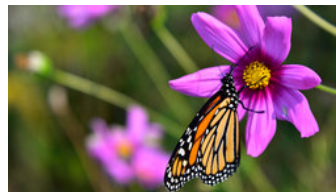
